# Palm Sunday, led by Rev Peter Churcher

# **The Triumphal Entry**

You will need your bible an item of outdoor clothing and – if you have one – a palm cross.

## Welcome and opening prayer

Almighty God,

your Son Jesus Christ was acclaimed as King and Saviour as he entered Jerusalem.

May we welcome him daily into our hearts through faith, and prepare to deny ourselves, take up our own cross and follow him. Amen.

#### Today's Theme

It was on a Sunday that Jesus took on the city!
They wanted a Messiah to save them from Roman occupation.
They got a wandering preacher teaching peace, remorse, grace and love.

They wanted a king on a charger – the symbol of power.

They got a humble countryman riding on a donkey – a symbol of

poverty, humility and service.

They received him as a King with palms and glad hosannas. Yet his victory was to die as an innocent victim, a troublemaker.

Religious freaks usually go out in the desert, urging folk to leave all that behind and get back to nature. God, it seems, doesn't live in the city! He prefers gardens to gutters, rivers to roads, hills to houses?! The city is the place of sin!?

But Jesus rides into the city from the Mount of Olives – a King on donkey – following the prophecy of Zechariah! And the city dwellers

throw down their cloaks, strew the steep road with palm leaves and some cry out, "Who is this? Who has come to save us?"
"Only Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth!"

Take time to think...Where do you find Jesus most easily? In the beauty of the countryside?

Or in the busyness and grime of the city?

#### Reading Matthew 21.1-11

#### A Symbolic Act and Reflection

The crowd laid down their clothes before Jesus and cut palm leaves to strew on the steep road. This was their way of rolling out the red carpet in welcome as they shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David!"

How excited are you to be a follower of Jesus? To proclaim his name?

Take your item of clothing and lay it before you as you repeat several times...

"Come to my heart, Lord Jesus. There is room in my heart for you."

Take up your palm cross – place it in your window where passers-by can see it.

Imagine yourself telling all your neighbours why you are so excited that Jesus has come into your life! You can speak it out loud, say it silently or write it down.

#### Today's theme

#### A symbolic action and reflection

Take a pile of 6 coins and one by one take each one in your hand, .....reflect on each as below..... then create a new pile.

For each coin, contemplate something that needs our Lord's help to change in order to truly reflect his kingdom values...

In the wider world in this country in Ilfracombe
In Pip and Jim's In your family in your own life

Take up the coins again and pray in your own words for those changes to come about and an openness in you to allow - and even to take action to effect - those changes.

#### **Prayers**

# Holy Tuesday, led by Rev Clive Thomas

You will need your bible and a handful of 10 or so coins

#### Jesus is betrayed

#### Introduction and opening prayer

Father God, we come before you in humility, aware of our weakness and wickedness and your unfathomable perfection and glory. Today we offer ourselves to you, knowing that you are full of compassion and mercy, slow to anger and of great goodness. You do not always accuse us nor do you keep your anger for ever. You do not deal with us according to our sins nor reward us according to your wickedness, but as a father has compassion on his children, so you are merciful towards us who honour you. Take us as we are, cleanse us from our sin, and anoint us with your Spirit, we may deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

# Today's theme

It was on the Tuesday that Jesus was betrayed! But it wasn't just Judas that was angry with him!

The chief priests and elders weren't used to being questioned.

"You can't just come into our city and throw your weight about, telling us we've got it all wrong. We're the leaders, the chosen ones. We're in charge here!" But he saw through their bluster.

They weren't used to having some upstart teaching against them, whipping up enthusiasm amongst the hoi-polloi. Telling stories against them of wedding banquets and tenants in the vineyard. Calling them hypocrites and blind guides, snakes and whitewashed tombs! He needed to be got rid of - and quickly! Arrested and killed when others would be too busy to notice!

But they loved Judas – how a name can be passed down in history to signify betrayal! Was he dishonest, money grabbing? Did he feel Jesus was misguided, weak, not zealous enough – not going to drive out the Roman oppressors? Or too much against Temple, the chief priests and elders?

Did he realise his mistake when he saw Jesus led away in chains? Did Jesus engage him eyeball to eyeball, causing Judas to see him for who he truly is? Did Jesus ever forgive Judas? Could Jesus have triumphed on the cross without Judas playing his part?

**Reading** Matthew 26.1-5 and 14-16

#### Symbolic actions and reflection

You may not have 30 pieces of silver! But we collectively betray Jesus on a daily basis by not living up to his expectations. Let's use the coins we have to symbolise our own faults and/or the sins of the world, and pray for his forgiveness. For each of the commandments we have failed to keep, place a coin in front of you.

#### Have we...

- clung to other gods, comforts or sources of wisdom or failed to put God first in our actions and decisions?
- made an idol out of money, power, popularity, knowledge, sex, possessions, how we look...anything else?
- misused the name of God before others...or played down our faith in him before others?
- remembered to allocate enough time when we put God first?
- honoured our parents and given them the respect, generosity and love that God shows to us?
- committed murder or kept hatred, suspicion or angry feelings towards others in our hearts?

- committed adultery or lusted after others or possessions?
- taken things that don't belong to us?
- told lies about others?
- been jealous or envious of others or their possessions?

Repeat this prayer to yourself until it becomes part of you...

# Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God Have mercy on me, a sinner

The money in front of you represents your betrayal of Jesus.

Dirty money?

Jesus bore the weight of the sins of the whole world on his shoulders on the cross – including yours and mine.

By dying for you, he has forgiven you.

But he wants to give it back to you.

It has been cleansed – a sign that Jesus has cleansed you by his blood.

You have been set free. Take it up. It's precious.

Use it – and any other money you have - to do good in his name.

# **Holy Wednesday**, led by Rev Clive Thomas Jesus is anointed

You will need some perfume, after shave, a fragrant ointment or perfumed hand gel, or something similar... and your bible.

#### Introduction and opening prayer

Most merciful God, you have prepared for those who love you such good things that surpass our understanding. Pour out your love upon us, that we, loving you above and beyond all things, may receive your promises, which far exceed all we could desire or deserve; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Today's theme

It was on the Wednesday that called him a waster.

The place smelt like the perfume department of Banbury's!

It was as if someone had sent a perfume bottle crashing to the floor, setting off the most expensive stink bomb on earth!

But this happened, not in a shop, but in a house of leper — an outcast!

And the woman was the poorest of the poor - another outcast - giving away the most precious thing she had!

And those who saw her pour the liquid over his hair and feet - wiping them with her own hair - remembered that he was against extravagance and called him and waster!

They'd forgotten that he was the poorest of the poor.

Those who had much — who had given him nothing — objected to the pauper giving him everything.

And Jesus told them that such beauty in simplicity – this act of holy love - will always be remembered.

It was on the Wednesday when the poor woman's generous love became an embarrassment to their comfort – and they called him a waster!

#### Reading Matthew 26.6-13

## A symbolic act and reflection

Pure nard was a very expensive perfume.

Take time to smell the fragrance you have. Rub it on your hands...indulge yourself in the sensations...

Imagine the scene with Jesus and the woman anointing him with oil.

Where are you and what is your role there?

Exactly what is she doing...how? How does it make you feel?

Notice the room and who is in it. What do you see...hear...smell...feel?

What is the reaction of those in the room - Simon the Leper, the disciples...?

Observe the body language...look at the expression of the face of Jesus and the woman...the others...smell the fragrance...notice the reactions of others...sense the love...hear Jesus' words.

How do the others react...? How do you react...?

How does the scene end? Bring yourself back to now.

#### **Prayers of Praise and Adoration**

The woman used the ointment, her hands, her hair to love the Lord.

Let us show our love for our Lord by contemplating his many names. What does each name mean to you? How do you see Jesus when you think of these names?

Take time to address Jesus by each of these names and notice what feelings or images come to mind.

# Maundy Thursday, led by Rev Peter Churcher

## The new commandment, the Last Supper, and Gethsemane

You will need: a bible, a glass or cup, a plate

#### Introduction and opening prayer

God, our Father, you have invited us to celebrate the supper which your Son gave to the church to proclaim his death until he comes. May he nourish us by his presence, and unite us in his love; for he is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

#### Today's themes

It was on the Thursday that he said his goodbye!

Jesus celebrated with - and taught - his disciples as they ate the

Passover meal together. He even upset them by taking the role of the
servant washing their feet! The Master washing the servant's feet?

Unheard of! Not done! Yet a powerful image they would not forget!

He said goodbye to his trusted team! They were confused. "Where are
you going? Can we come too?" Had they really not listened to anything
he had told them before?

He sent Judas on the way of betrayal. He challenged Peter that even he would deny him 3 times. And he told his disciples that they would all fall away because of him.

Was this really a celebration? Or a cataclysmic warning?
Did they listen? Did they understand? As usual...not a bit!
But also as usual...he was proved right! Prophetic or what?
And he gave them a new commandment – to love one another as he had loved them – by this, others would know that they are his disciples, but only if they had love for one another. And he promised them the gift

of the Holy Spirit. This was all too much to take in for one night! Especially after food and wine!

And he gave them the sacrament by which he would be remembered for all time. They thought they were celebrating the Passover festival, but the suffering of the next day would not 'pass over' their Lord Jesus, nor 'pass over' them. It would be very real. Very painful.

Too much to bear.

And he celebrated his last supper with them, but did they understand the symbolism of the bread and wine – his body and blood?

**Reading – Matthew 26.26-30. The Last Supper** 

#### A symbolic act

Before you is a cup and plate. At this time, we cannot celebrate the Lord's Supper together, and church tradition does not allow us to celebrate communion alone. So let us remind ourselves of the meal that Jesus left with us, by which he will always be remembered.

As you take the plate into your hands remember...

The bread of the presence in the Old Testament Temple symbolised God united with his people...

Remember the feeding of the five thousand, how so many were fed from just 5 loaves...

Jesus said, I am the bread of life...the living bread...those who come to me will never go hungry, whoever eats of this bread will live for ever.

The bread is my flesh which I give for the life of the world.

Jesus took the bread, gave thanks, broke it and said, "Take and eat. This is my body."

Paul reminds us, "Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body because all share the one bread."

As you take the cup into your hands, remember...

Jesus said, "This is my blood poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

St Paul asks us, "Is not the cup of thanksgiving... a participation in the blood of Christ?"

As you remember the act of communion, remember that Christ died for you and be thankful.

#### **Prayers**

Father, on this night your Son our Lord was betrayed by one of his disciples.

Give us the resolve never to let him down, betray his trust in us, or belittle his importance in our lives.

#### Lord hear us, and keep us humble

Father, on this night Jesus washed the feet of his disciples.

May we follow the example of the Suffering Servant by our humility, our service to others and love for the marginalised.

## Lord hear us, and keep us humble

Father, on this night Jesus prayed for his disciples to be united and to love one another.

Unite your church in the bond of peace, in love for one another and for those who do not yet know you.

# **Good Friday**, led by Rev Peter Churcher The Crucifixion

You will need a cross and 7 small stones or coins

#### Todays' theme

It was on the Friday...

It was on Good Friday that it came to an end.

They did what they wanted. They got what they wanted.

They didn't do it alone. They did it in crowds – it's safer that way! In the Sanhedrin. The religious council.

In a crowd of soldiers. In the baying mob before Pilate. On the Via Dolorosa.

And he said nothing. He did not fight back

He took the insults, the bruises, the spit in the face, the whip, the curses, the friends running away.

And he said nothing.

He let them do their worst – until their worst was done.

They led like a lamb to the slaughter and did not open his mouth.

They pierced him for our sins and crushed him for our iniquities.

It was on the Friday they ended it all.

And he said..."Father forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

# Reading – Matthew 27.32-56

#### An act of remembrance

During the three hours on the cross, Jesus gave his last 7 "words" or utterances.

As we sit, stand or kneel before the cross, hear those words for yourself. Place a stone or coin at the foot of the cross as you meditate on each sentence.

What is Jesus saying to us through these words?

A day of grieving and mourning

You will need your bible and a cross

#### **Introduction and Opening Prayer**

Loving Father, your Son Jesus Christ said "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted." Be with us in times of waiting and mourning, Of doubt and confusion, fear and uncertainty. To you, O Lord we lift up our souls. O God, in you we trust, for you are the God of our Salvation. Amen.

#### Todays' theme

It was on the Saturday that came the lockdown.

"Stay indoors. You are not safe. You could be arrested. What is out there is toxic...the whole world is against us!
What is happening? What have we lost? Everything!"
Grief. Mourning. Fear. Lost hopes. Lost dreams.
They had seen their Lord, their Master, their friend and Saviour, crucified. He was dead. In the tomb.

All his promises...all his brave and comforting words...all his healings and miracles...his identity as Messiah...have all come crashing down. So now, locked in a safe house, in shock and despair, abandoned, alone, his disciples and his women followers grieve, shedding tears of blood. "Why? Why have you forsaken us? Where are you, Lord, now when we need you most?

Where did it all go wrong? Were we duped? Was he a false Messiah...like so many others? Did we miss something?

But no! See how the crowds loved him! See how he changed our world...their world. See the hope, the healing, the life he brought. How he sought out the lost, brought in the outcast, lifted up the lowly, challenged the powers that be.

But how can he be the Messiah lying dead in a tomb? So now we have to get used to a new normal. Without him.

A new way of being. Fearful. Afraid of admitting to knowing and following him. Keeping apart from others who know us. Looking away in the street, maintaining our distance, in isolation. How long can this go on?

What do we do now? Can we survive?

We don't know what his followers did that Saturday. But just maybe they looked back to the cross, to his words for a clue as to what they had missed.

On the cross Jesus himself cried out, "My God, my God! Why have you forsaken me?" The cry of desolation, despair and dereliction. That is a quote from Psalm 22. So let's read the psalm and imagine those locked down reading this trying to make sense of the last days.

## **Reading Psalm 22**

#### A time to reflect...

Let's read the psalm again, in chunks, noticing how this psalm, written 1000 years before, predicts Jesus' suffering on the cross

V1-5 His cry of abandonment by the Father who should be protecting him.

V5-8 How appropriate these words relating to Jesus, mocked by those around him at the foot of the cross. (Now read Mt 27.46, Mk 15.34) V9-11 another cry to the Father

V12-18 How many references to his suffering on the cross here?

Who are 'the bulls' – those anxious/determined to see Jesus silenced? Is this not describing Jesus on the cross? – he called out "I thirst" (John19.2)

Dogs/evildoers are indeed circling around his wasting body.

They divide his clothes among them (see. Mt27.35, Mk15.24, Luke 34.34 John V19ff Now see how the mood changes from despair to hope, proclamation and promise.

V24 He has *not* despised...disdained the suffering of *the afflicted one* hidden...but...

V25ff I will fulfil my vows...so he can't be dead! Nations will remember and turn to the Lord (that is now Jesus?)

V31 He has done it! "It is finished" Jn 19.30)

If this was a psalm of David, how amazing that it so accurately predicts Jesus' suffering on the cross and this role as the suffering servant (Isaiah 52.13-53) Was this any help to those in lockdown on Holy Saturday? Does it bring comfort to you in today's lockdown?

**Prayer before the cross** – *just place the cross before you as you pray* There are those today, Lord, who are isolated, lonely and afraid

## Why have you forsaken us?

Yet, for some, life goes on without any care for others
Why have you forsaken us?
Lord we know you do not despise or disdain
the suffering of any afflicted one. You hear our cry for help.
We turn to you in our desolation, for dominion belongs to you.
May we see your healing love through your Holy Spirit
and through those who minister your healing grace.
May, in Jesus's name, all suffering be turned into joy.
Save us and comfort us,
so that we might declare your righteousness,
proclaiming that you, Lord, have done it! Amen!

We remember that this was all part of God's amazing plan Christ suffered for us,
leaving us an example that we should follow in his steps
He committed no sin, no guile was found on his lips;
when he was reviled he did not revile in turn
When he suffered he did not threaten,
but he trusted himself to God who judges justly.
Christ himself bore our ins in his body on the tree
that we might die to sin and live to righteousness

By his wounds we have been healed, for we were straying like sheep but have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of our souls.

From 1 Peter 2.21-25

Come to visit us, O God, this night, so that by your strength we may rise with the new day, to rejoice in the resurrection of your Son, Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen

May the life-giving cross be the source of all our comfort and our peace. Amen.

**Introduction and Opening Prayer** 

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

Lord of all life and power, who through the mighty resurrection of your Son overcame the old order of sin and death to make all things new in him: grant that we, being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in glory; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour, glory and might, now and in all eternity.

#### Todays' theme

Early, on Sunday morning, three women head towards Jesus' tomb. They intend to anoint Jesus' body with some more spices. If they were honest they hadn't thought this through – they knew there would be guards and a big, heavy stone in the way, and no way they could move it – but they just had to go. To pay their respects. To say one last good bye to their friend. Yet when they got there the guards were asleep, the stone was rolled back, and a man was sat on top of it. 'Don't be alarmed,' he said. How could they not. Who was this man? Where was their Jesus? The women shook as the man continued. 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."'

The women shook with terror and ran away as fast as they could.

Could it really be true? Could they really believe?

Could they really tell anyone?

And then they saw him. "Hello" Jesus said, "don't be afraid."

Jesus Christ is risen from the dead.

#### Alleluia.

He has defeated the powers of death.

#### Alleluia.

Jesus turns our sorrow into dancing.

#### Alleluia.

He has the words of eternal life.

Alleluia.
